The Divine Comedy (Italian: la Divina Commedia, first called the Divina Commedia only in 1555 by a Venetian publisher[1]) is an epic poem written by Dante Alighieri between 1308 and his death in 1321. It is widely considered the preeminent work of Italian literature,[2] and is seen as one of the greatest works of world literature.[3] The poem's imaginative and allegorical vision of the afterlife is a culmination of the medieval world-view as it had developed in the Western Church. It helped establish the Tuscan dialect in which it is written as the standardized Italian.[4] It is divided into three parts, the Inferno, Purgatorio, and Paradiso. On the surface, the poem describes Dante's travels through Hell, Purgatory, and Heaven;[5] but at a deeper level, it represents allegorically the soul's journey towards God.[6] At this deeper level, Dante draws on medieval Christian theology and philosophy, especially the writings of Thomas Aquinas.[7] The work was originally simply titled *Commedia* and was later christened *Divina* by Giovanni Boccaccio. The first printed edition to add the word *divine* to the title was that of the Venetian humanist Lodovico Dolce,[8] published in 1555 by Gabriele Giolito de Ferrari.
