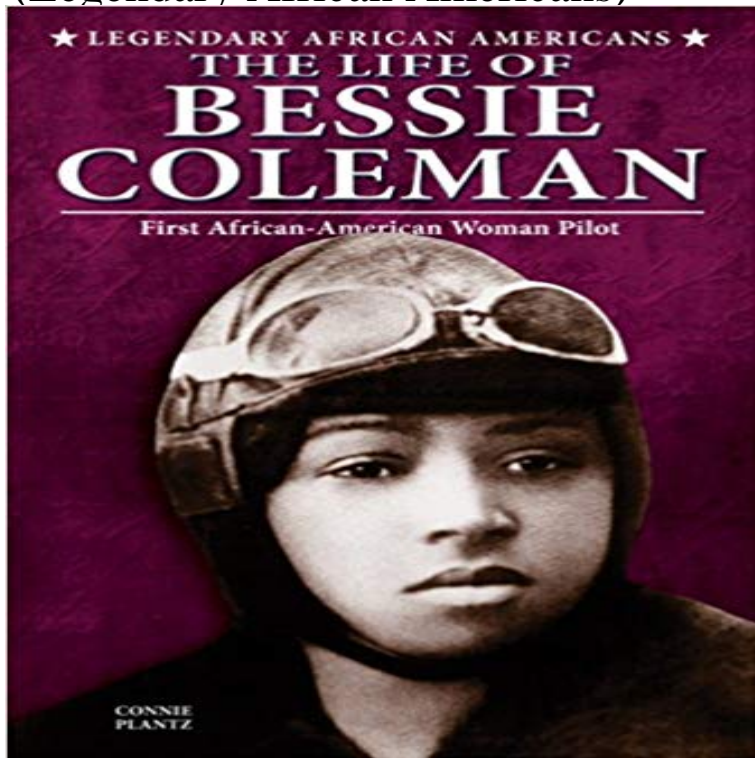


## The Life of Bessie Coleman: First African-American Woman Pilot (Legendary African Americans)
