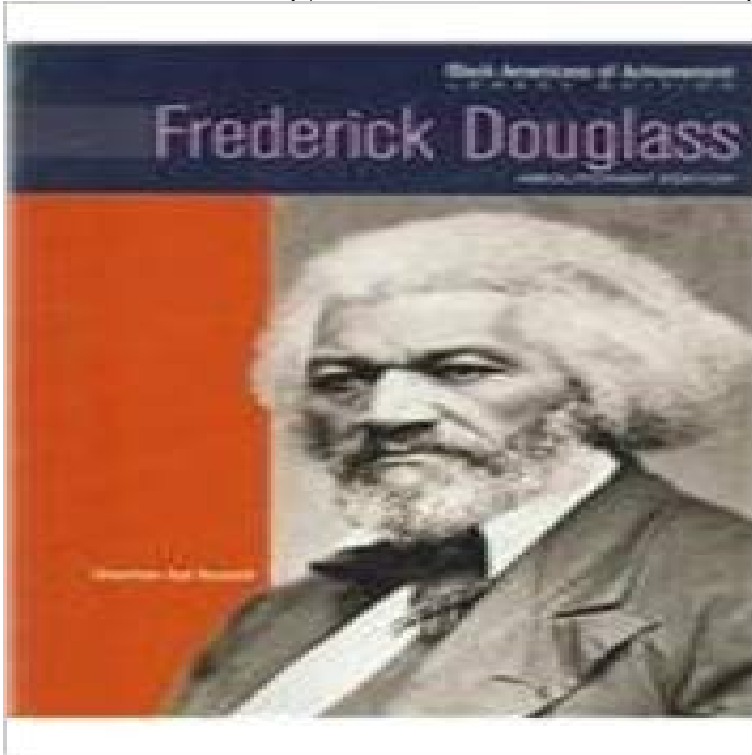


Frederick Douglass: Abolition Editor (Black Americans of Achievement)
