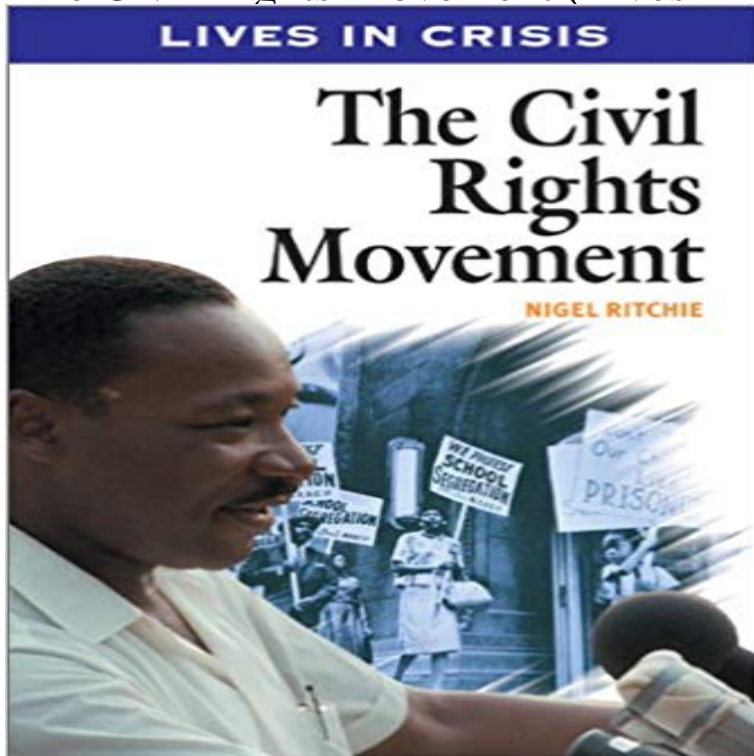


The Civil Rights Movement (Lives in Crisis)
